



We're investing to upgrade Manchester's electricity network

Strengthening reliability for homes, businesses, future development and essential services

What's happening

SP Electricity North West is investing £6.5 million in South Manchester on the Southern Gateway project, part of the Strategic Manchester Development Plan, a major upgrade to strengthen and future-proof Manchester's power network.

The project will help ensure the network has the capacity needed to support future homes, businesses and vital services across the city.

The work requires us to excavate the road and install new underground electricity cables. To keep disruption to a minimum, we will also be installing a new connection at the same time for a new cancer unit at Manchester Royal Infirmary, helping support a major healthcare investment for the area.

What work will take place

We will be installing new underground electricity cables along sections of the local road network and connecting them into existing infrastructure.

What disruption can I expect?

To carry out the work safely, temporary traffic management will be required at various stages of the project, including:

- Road closures
- Diversion routes
- Lane restrictions
- Suspension of some resident parking bays

Why is the work needed?

Manchester is growing and demand for electricity continues to increase.

This investment will help:

- Support future development across the city.
- Improve the flexibility and reliability of the local network.
- Enable a new connection for the Cancer Unit at Manchester Royal Infirmary.

We're working closely with Manchester City Council to minimise disruption wherever possible. Residents and businesses affected by specific phases of work will receive further information before work begins in their area.
