Working to end modern slavery

To enhance our approach to addressing the risks of modern slavery, Electricity North West is a founding member of Slave-Free Alliance, a social enterprise that works with organisations to eradicate modern slavery. Slave-Free Alliance is part of the charity Hope for Justice, which aims to end slavery by preventing exploitation, rescuing victims, restoring lives and reforming society.

Unfortunately, modern slavery is closer than you think; it's a global problem and the UK is no exception. While we need to be mindful of our suppliers overseas who operate in higher risk areas, there have been an ever-increasing number of cases of modern slavery reported in our region. Electricity North West is a responsible and significant local employer and we want everyone to understand the [common signs of slavery](#). By increasing awareness amongst our communities, we can work towards ending this abhorrent activity. This can't be something we dismiss as not being relevant to us.

At Electricity North West we are committed to tackling the issue of modern slavery both in our organisation and in the communities, we serve. For this reason, we provide training to colleagues on spotting the signs of slavery and what to do if you spot something and it does not seem right. We are also part of a nationwide multi-utility working group with the aim of making it as difficult as possible for slavery to exist in our industry. Our procurement and recruitment policies feature several measures which help us to reduce risk in both our business and our supply chain.
